COLEUS

Plectranthus scutellaroides

Splashy, colorful leaves with mixed patterns. Filler for containers and landscapes. Pinch stems to keep bushy. Height 12-24" Spread 18-36"













MARGUERITE DAISY Argyranthemum 'Butterfly'

Daisy-like white or yellow flowers. Great filler for beds, groundcover and baskets. Height 18-36" Spread 12-20"





MILLION BELLS Calibrochoa hybrid

Blue, red, white, orange, pink and yellow 1-inch blooms summer through fall. Good for containers and baskets. Height 6-10" Spread 12-18"










ANISE HYSSOP Agastache foeniculum

Upright, aromatic, clumpforming herb. Long blooming in beds and borders. Edible leaves and seeds.



















FALSE INDIGO Baptisia australis 'Blueberry Sundae', 'Screaming Yellow' Shrub-like with blue-green

leaves and pea-shaped blue or yellow flowers. Blooms early summer on upright stalks. Durable, tap-rooted, long-lived. Height 3-4' Spread 3-4'





Threadleaf Coreopsis Coreopsis verticillata 'Zagreb', 'Moonlight'

Long blooming yellow daisylike flowers and airy looking fine textured leaves for gardens and borders. Height 2.5-3' Spread 1.5-2'














BOXWOOD Buxus 'Green Velvet'

Evergreen, glossy, dark leaves tolerant of shearing. Good resisistance to bronzing in the winter.

Height 3-4' Spread 3-4'









BIRD NEST SPRUCE Picea abies 'Nidiformis'

Slow growing dwarf evergreen conifer featuring spreading, horizontal branches that form a broad, flat globe. Mature plants have a depression or "nest" in the top center. Height 2-8' Spread 3-12'







DWARF FOTHERGILLA Fothergilla gardenia 'Mount Airy'

Compact, slow growing, mounding deciduous shrub. White bottlebrush shaped, aromatic flowers in May. Leaves turn brilliant shades of orange and red in fall. Height 3-5' Spread 2-4'









GINKGO Ginkgo biloba

Great lawn, street or shade tree. Leathery two-lobed, fan-shaped leaves turn bright yellow in fall. Considered a living fossil. Plant male trees. Height 50-80' Spread 30-40'







RIVER BIRCH Betula nigra 'Heritage', 'Dura Heat®'

Fast growing, single or multitrunked shade tree. Pyramidal to round-shaped crown. Exfoliating bark and leathery 2-3" leaves. Produces catkin fruits. Thrives in moist or dry soil. Height 40-70' Spread 40-60'









THORNLESS HONEYLOCUST Gleditsia triacanthos inermis 'Skyline'

Pyramid crown with greenish white flowers in May provides sundappled shade. Leaves turn yellow in fall. Tolerant of wind, salt, heat, and drought. Height 60-80' Spread 60-80'









WISHBONE FLOWER Torenia fournieri

Small bushy annual with clown-faced blue, white or pink flowers. Blooms profuesly through fall. Minimal deadheading. For containers, landscapes and mass plantings. Height 8-12" Spread 12"









WILD BLEEDING HEART Dicentra eximia

Delicate pink flowers on arching stems April to September. Ornamental foliage. Self-sows when happy. For landscaping and mass planting.

Height 8-12" Spread 12-18"













NINEBARK Physocarpus opulifolius 'Summer Wine', 'Coppertina'

Upright, spreading branches, red fruit and exfoliating bark. Red, orange. or green leaves. Small pink or white flowers. Good in groupings and borders. Height 5-8' Spread 4-6'











SMOOTH ASTER Symphyotrichum laeve 'Bluebird'

Clusters of large 1" violet-blue flowers with yellow centers bloom August - September. No staking needed. Height 2-3' Spread 2-3'











SWAMP ROSE MALLOW Hibiscus moscheutos

Graceful pink to white flowers bloom August - September. Emerges in late spring. Woody, shrub-like perennial. Height 3-7' Spread 2-4'









SWITCHGRASS Panicum virgatum 'Northwind', 'Shenendoah'

Ornamental grass with a stiff columnar form. Use as an accent, massing or screen. Pink tinged blooms appear in July. Tolerates wet or dry soils. Height 3-6' Spread 2-3'
